There was general discussion regarding what information we would like to glean from this gathering, and what our definition of a successful meeting would be. Highlights of the discussion included:	
Do we "build it and they will come" or do we "program to the stated need"?	
Must address the "What's In It For Me" issue	
Need to romance the participants	
A successful meeting result would be the opening of a dialogue within the senior community between various groups who may share similar concerns and see value in working together to enable everyone to stay in the community as they age. The emergence of an affiliate uber organization representing a greater percentage of seniors in the community would be a very successful meeting result.	
Questions to be used as a guide to exploring this strong common voice concept could be:	
 How do we speak with a common voice? 	
 Do you see a benefit to a strong voice for seniors in the community? 	
 How do you see your group engaging? 	
 What does an 'uber seniors' organization' look like? 	
 How do we help seniors in Whistler to take an active role bringing needed services and activities to the community? 	
 A "Seniors Voice" organization could simply be a representative group of older people with an active interest in the issues relating to seniors and a commitment to ensuring that seniors have a strong voice in the community. 	
 How do we develop and sustain channels for liaison and dialogue with individual and organizational senior members about seniors' issues in Whistler?
