

New MAC Website Project Made possible with a Grant from Community Services Recovery Fund

- Not just a re-design of the website but a total re-write of the website content in order to bring it in line with the new strategic plan for (MAC)
- Much research was required to make sure that the website design, including colours, fonts, content, readability and functionality was suitable for seniors
- Necessary to provide easy to access information for our members such as event calendar, news articles, volunteer opportunities, newsletters, as well as provide information for those seeking resources and services to allow all seniors to live and age well in Whistler.




